# Web Browser VS Website

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- A **“Web Browser”** is a software that allows you to search the internet (Safari, Google Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, etc.)
- A **“Website”** or **“Webpage”** is a page on the internet where one can find information, post information, make purchases, etc.
- A **“Search Engine”** is a type of website that helps users search the internet (Google.com, Bing.com, Yahoo.com, Ask.com, etc.)



# Welcome to Safari



The “Safari” app is Apple’s web browser that they’ve pre-downloaded onto all of their device.

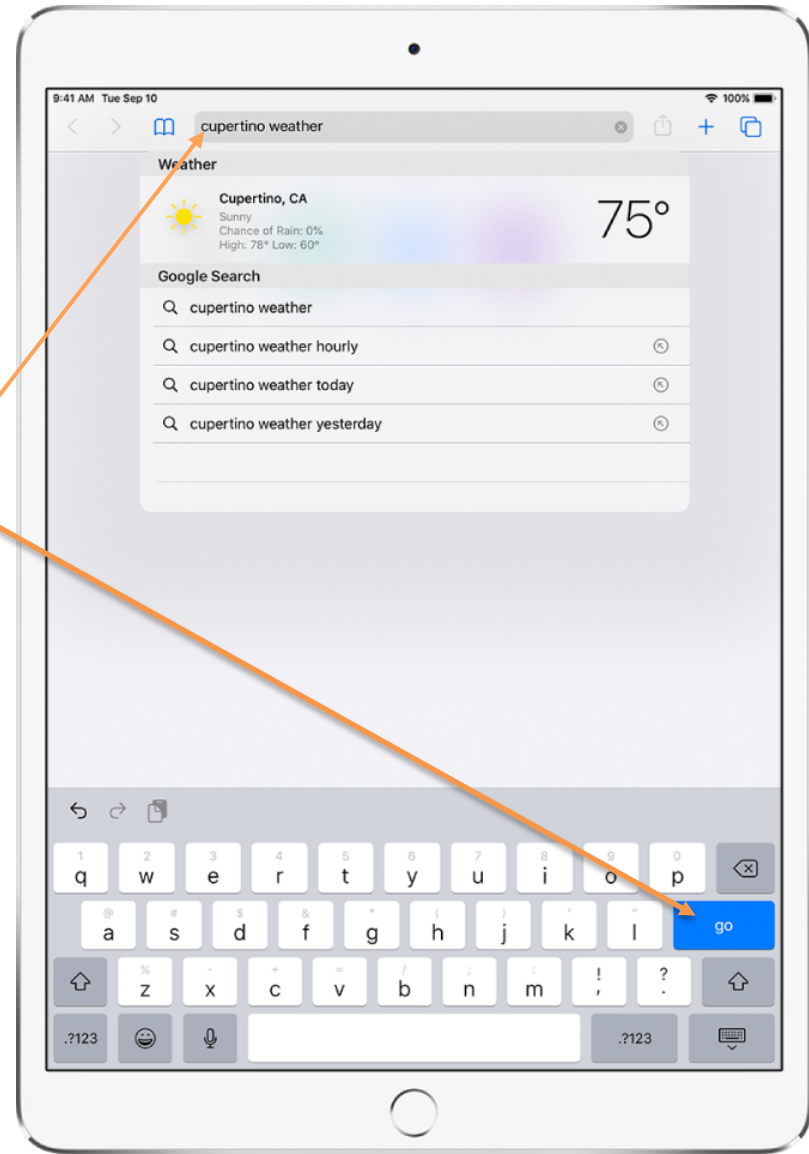


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# Searching the Internet

To search the internet or go to a website, tap the long rectangle at the top middle of the screen and then type the question, topic or website you wish you find. As you type, Safari will suggest popular topics or website that match what you're typing; if you'd like to use one of those suggestions, simply tap on that suggestion. When you're finished typing, tap "go" in the blue rectangle on your keyboard to begin your internet search.

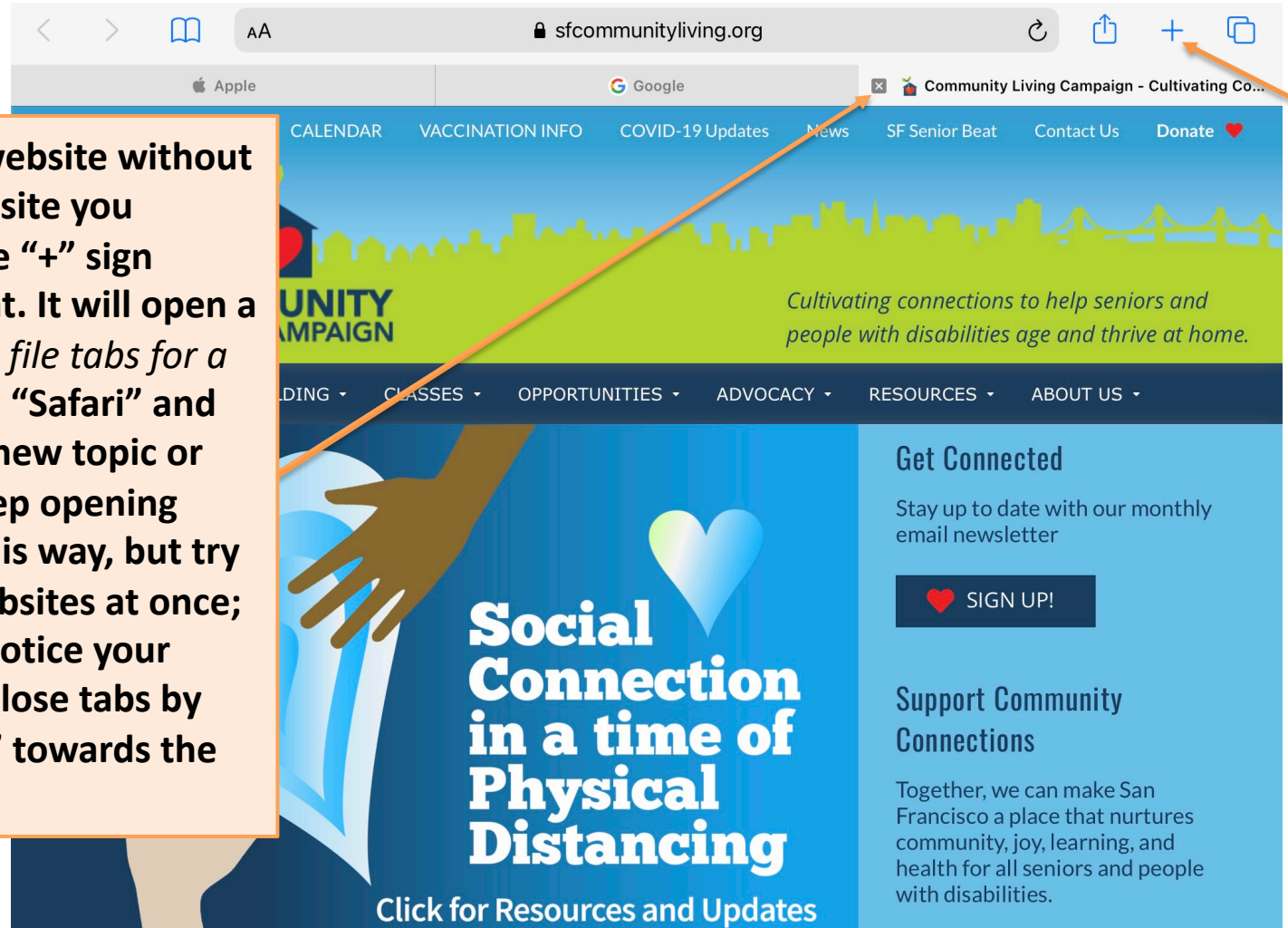






# Multiple Websites at the Same Time

To look at another website without leaving the first website you opened, tap the blue “+” sign towards the top right. It will open a new tab (resembling file tabs for a filing cabinet) within “Safari” and allow you to type a new topic or website. You can keep opening multiple websites this way, but try not to exceed 15 websites at once; otherwise you will notice your device slow down. Close tabs by tapping the little “x” towards the left of each tab.



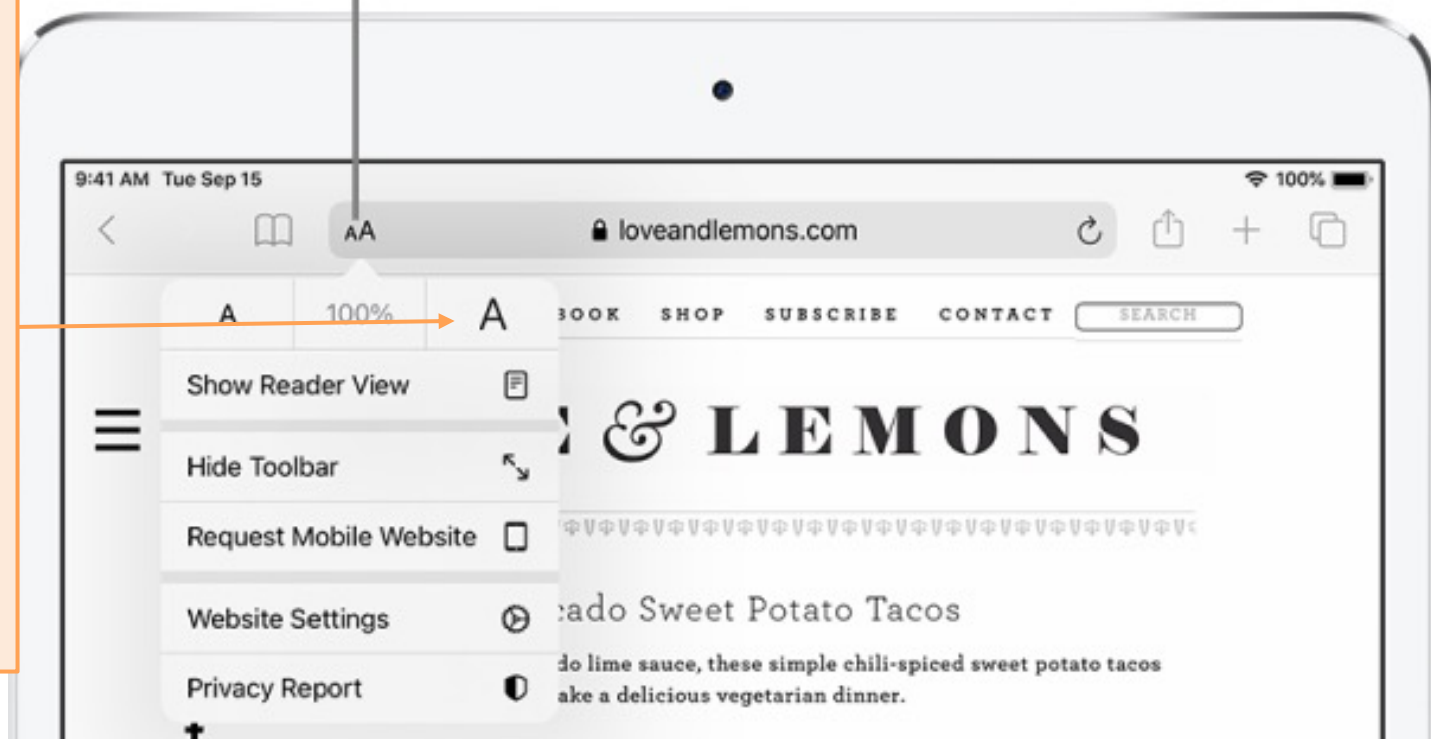




# Increasing Font Size

If you'd like the font size on a website to appear larger or smaller tap the "AA" icon at the top left, then tap the larger "A" at the top right of the drop down menu. Keep tapping "A" to keep increasing the font size.

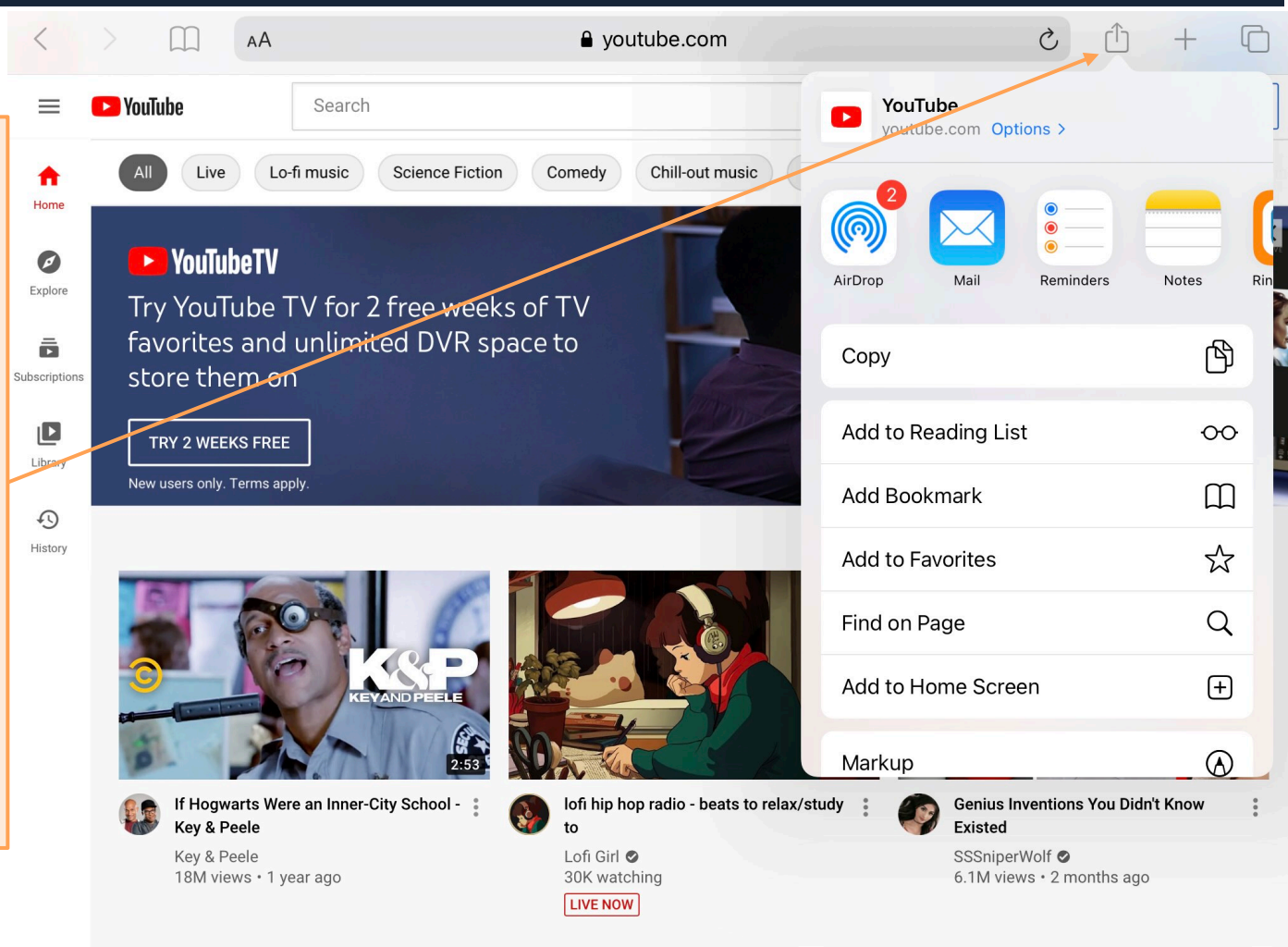
Tap to view the page in reader.





# Saving a Website

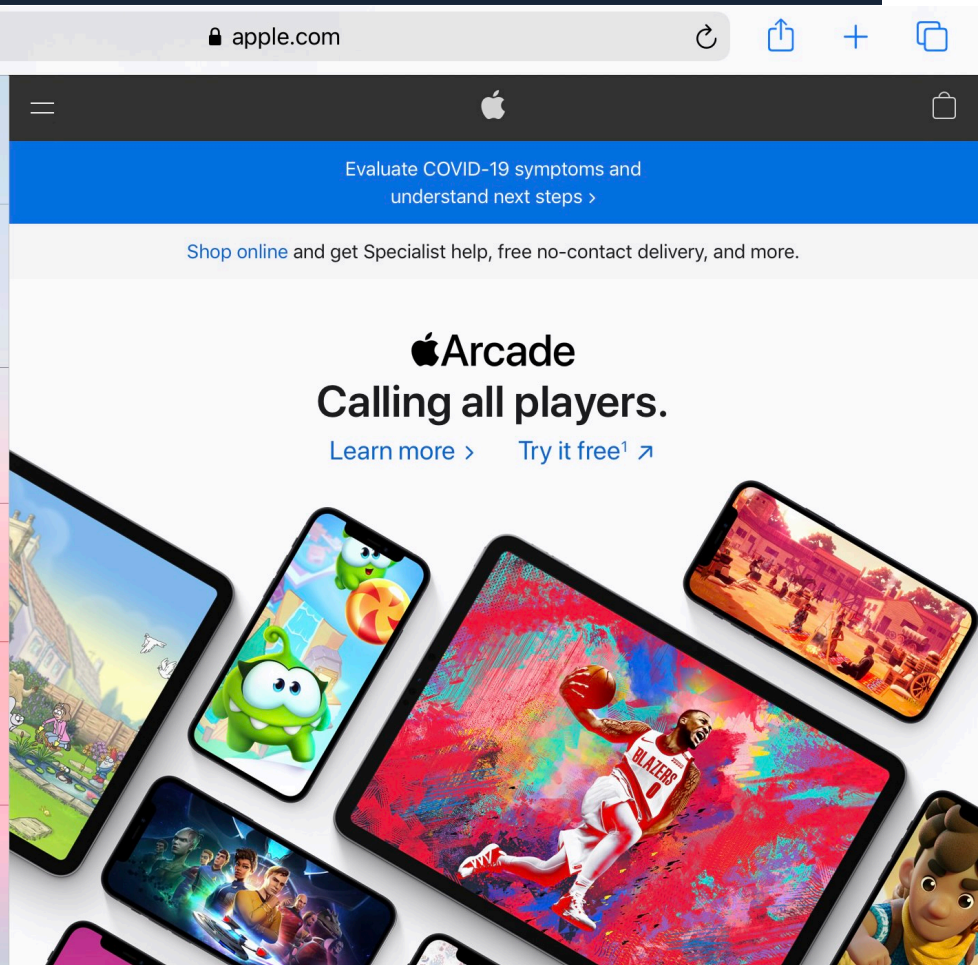
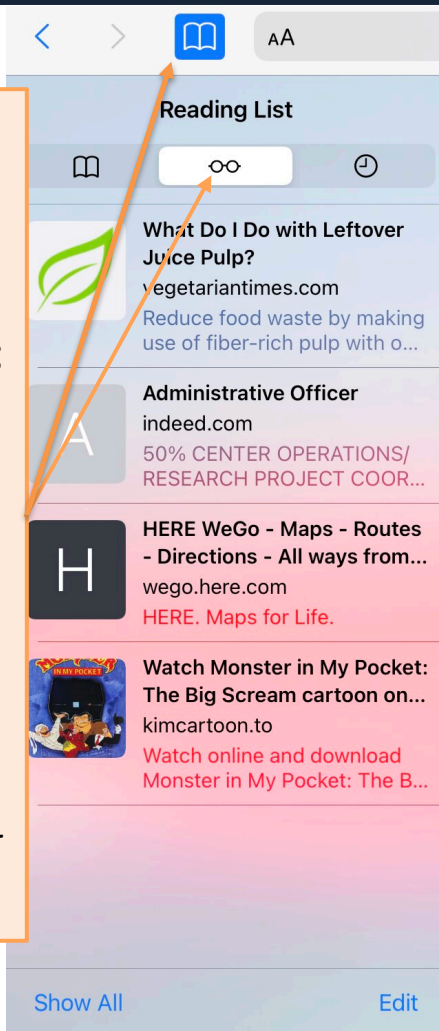
If you'd like to save a website you have multiple options on how to do so. Tap the icon with a square and upwards arrow at the top right. You can then save the website in an email, reminder, note, or add it to your "Reading List," "Bookmarks" or "Favorites."





# Adding to Reading List

If you add a website to your “Reading List” you can access it first tapping the open book icon towards the top left and then tapping eye-glasses icon towards the top middle. Websites will be temporarily saved in this list until you go back to them again (essentially using this list as a reminder to go back to the website at a later date).

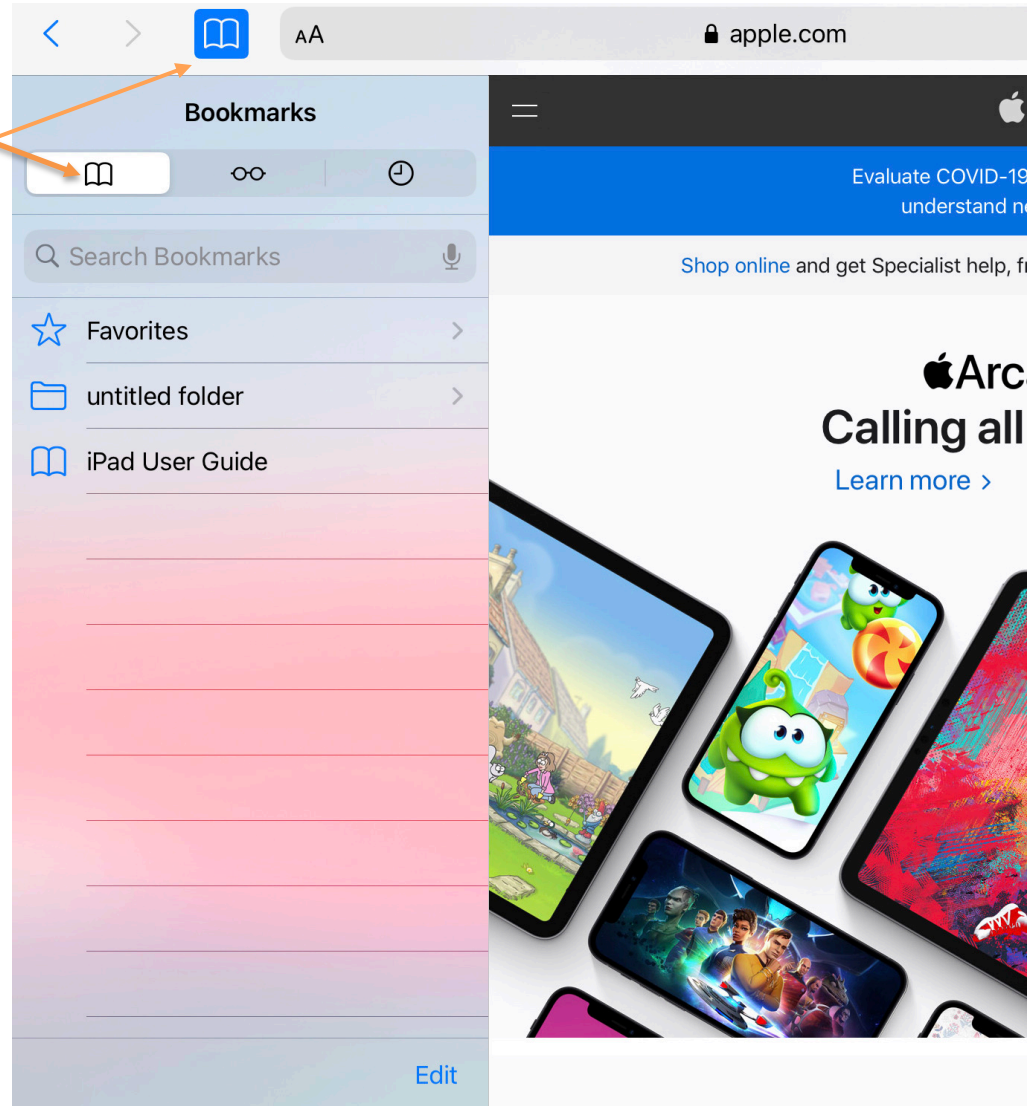






# Adding Bookmarks/Favorites

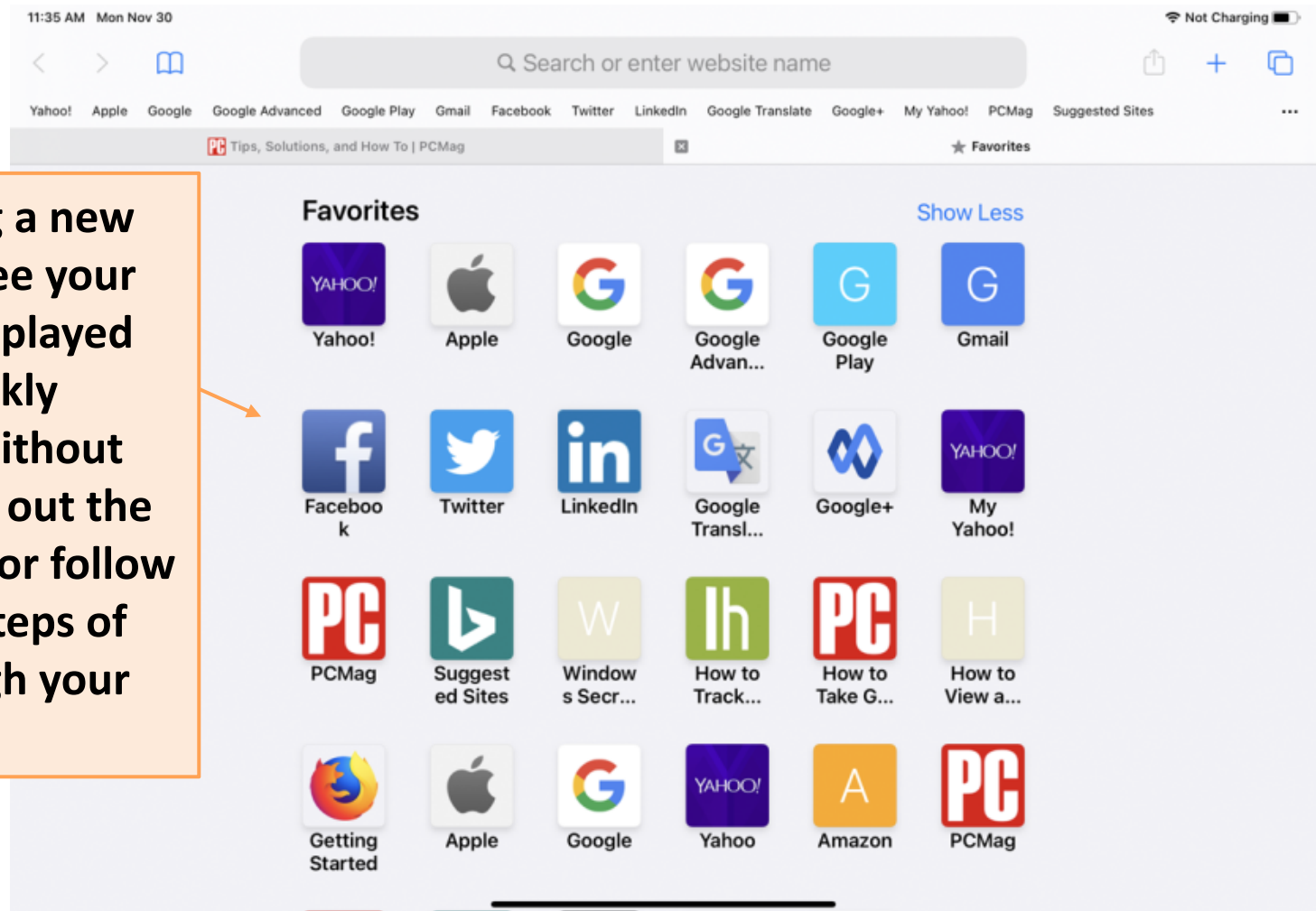
If you add a website to your “Bookmarks” or “Favorites,” you can access it the same way you would for your “Reading List,” but then tap the second open book icon to the left. “Favorites” is a folder within “Bookmarks” where you can save website you visit often for quick access. (Think of “Bookmarks” as the building, and “Favorites” as one of the rooms in the building; you can keep saving websites to your “Favorites” or you can create a new category/folder for your “Bookmarks.”)





# Bookmarks & Favorites

When opening a new tab, you will see your “Favorites” displayed for you to quickly access them without having to type out the website again or follow the previous steps of looking through your “Bookmarks.”



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# Find on Page

When looking through a website, you also have the option of searching for keywords on that website. First tap the icon with a square and upward arrow, then tap “Find on Page.”

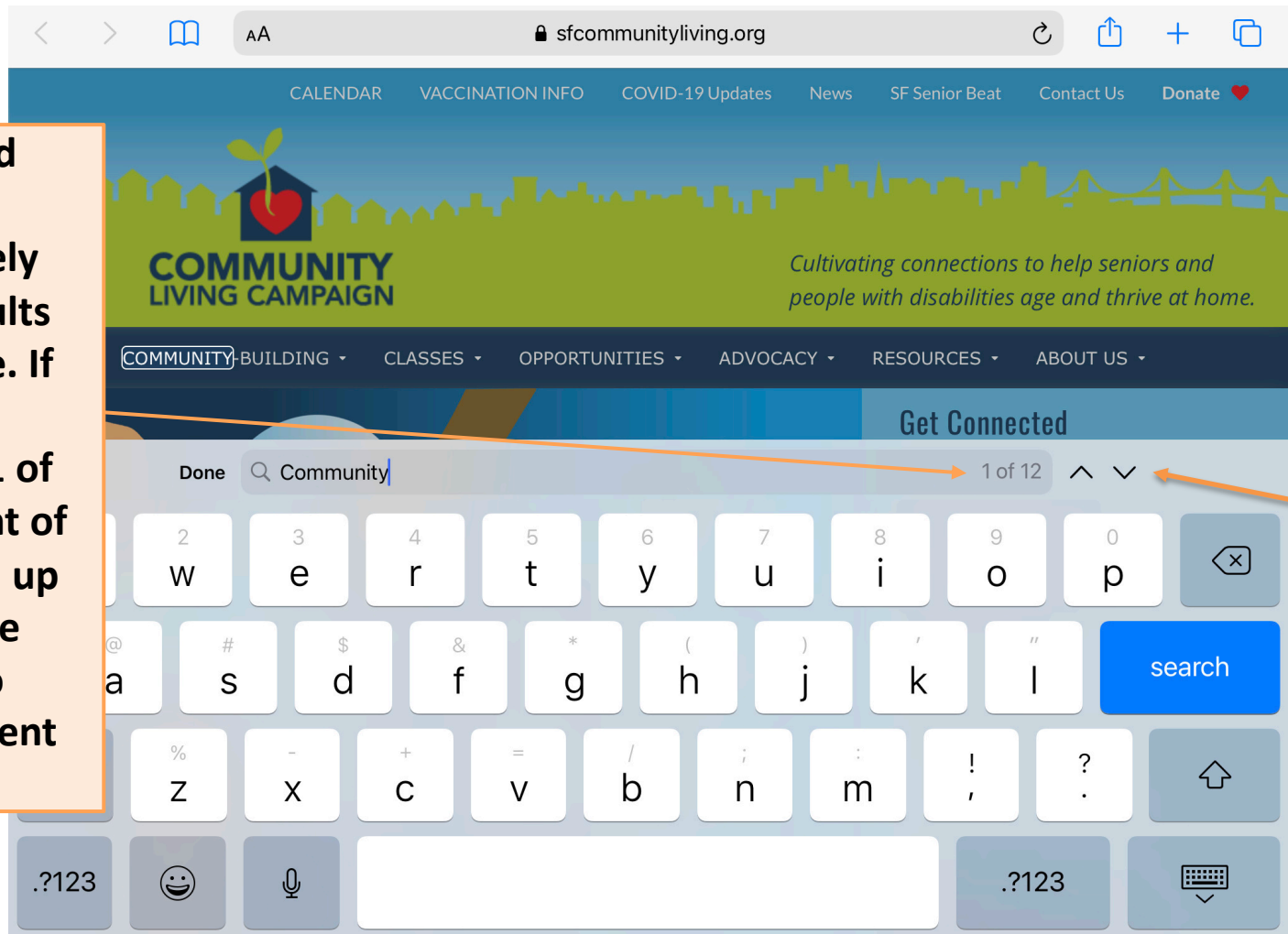

# Find on Page

Type the keyword you'd like to search for and "Safari" will immediately tell you how many results appear on that website. If there is more than one result, you will see a "1 of ?" towards the top right of your keyboard. Tap the up and down arrows to the right of that in order to look through the different results.

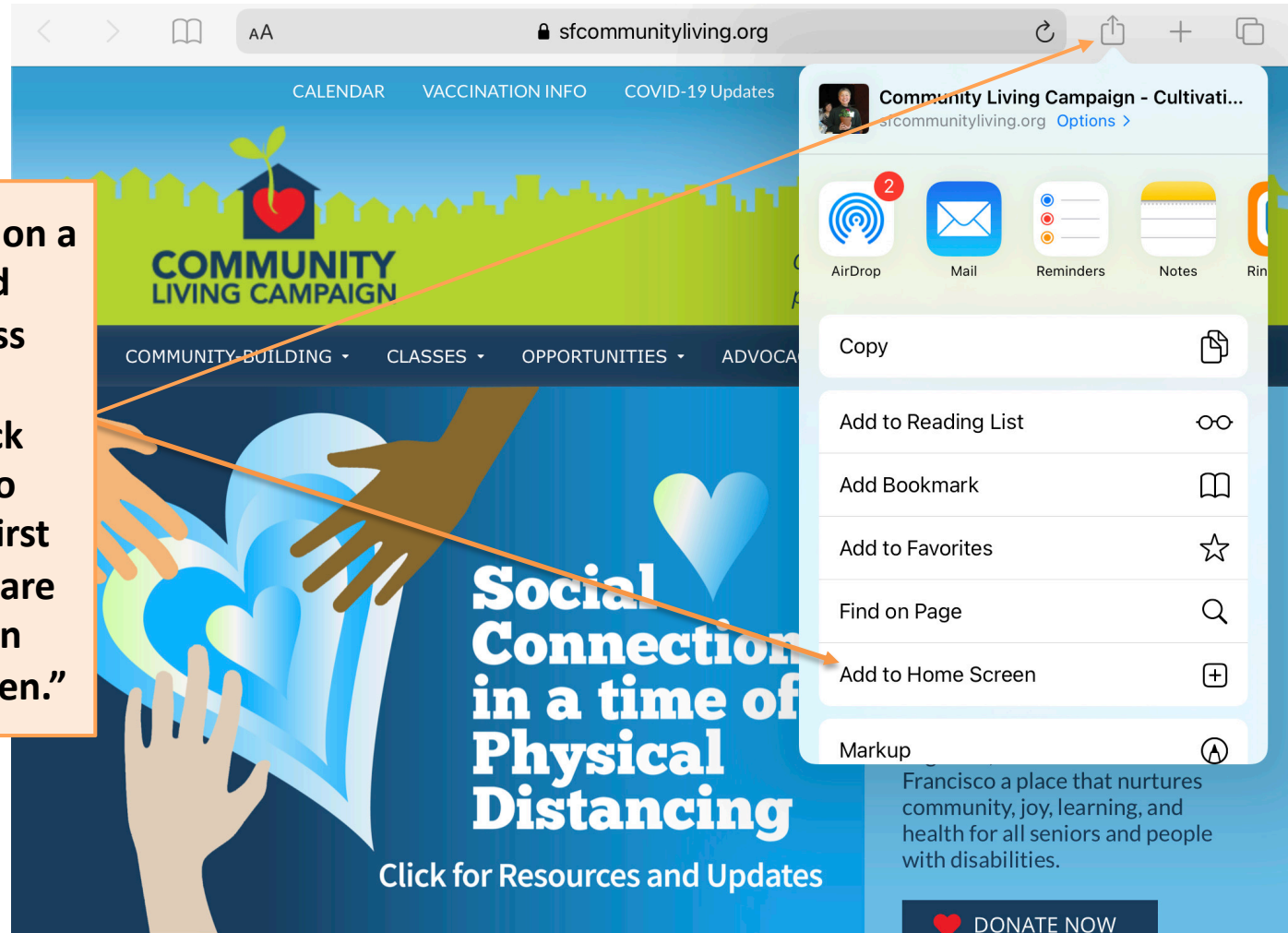






# Add to Home Screen

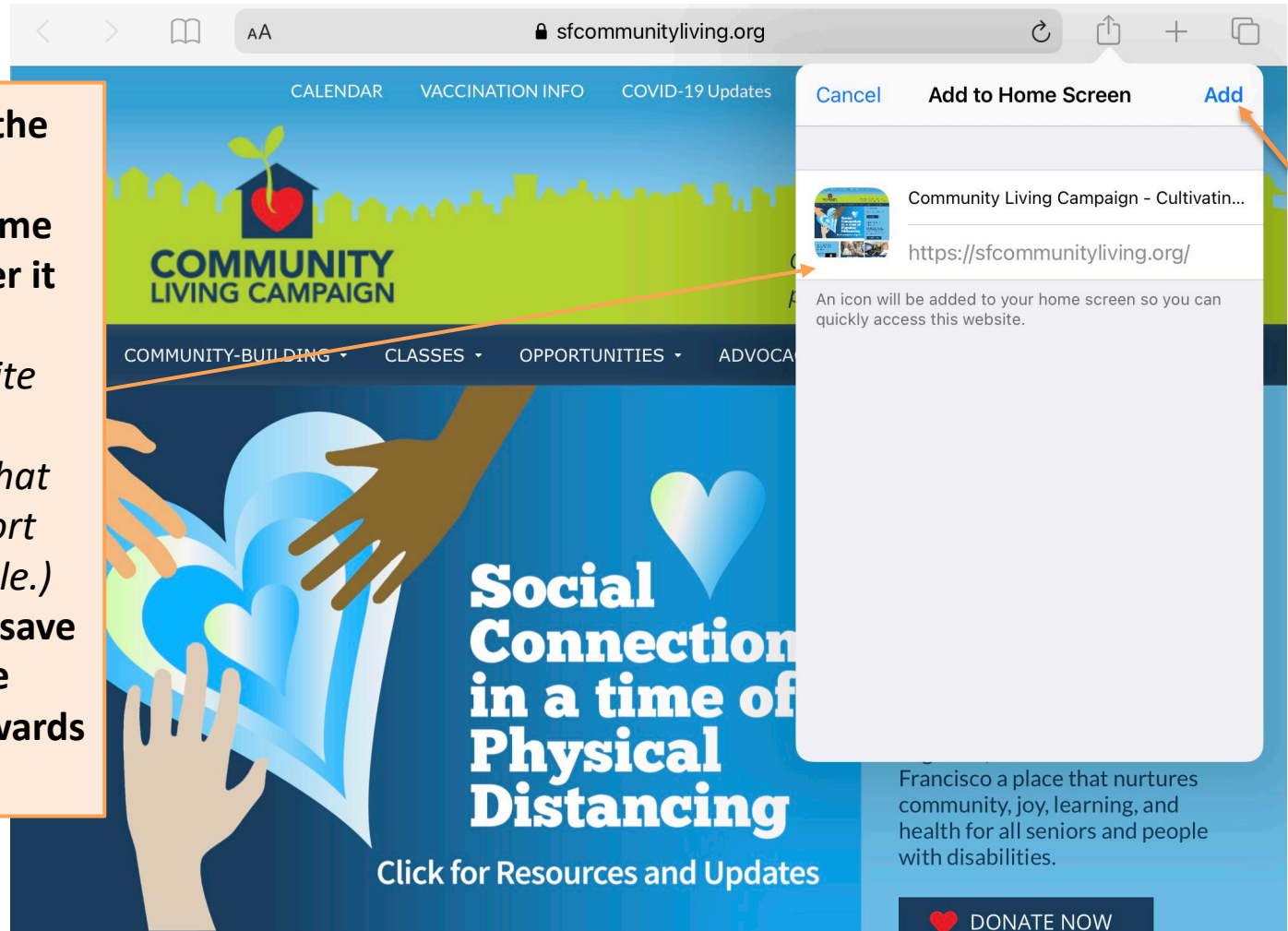
For websites you go to on a very frequent basis and desire immediate access to, you also have the option of adding a quick link to the website onto your “Home Screen.” First tap the icon with a square and upward arrow, then tap “Add to Home Screen.”





# Add to Home Screen

Now you can rename the link so that it will be displayed on your “Home Screen” how you prefer it to be displayed. (For example; for this website the user might want to rename this “CLC” so that the display name is short and quickly recognizable.) When you’re ready to save the link to your “Home Screen,” tap “Add” towards the top right corner.
