

The top five barriers to internet access:*

- cost of high-speed internet (28%)
- cost of device (27%)
- insufficient smartphone data (22%)
- unreliable internet connection (21%)
- concerns about online safety/security (19%)

* Especially communities of color, lowincome, LGBTQ, key neighborhoods

Assistive technology (AT) and training is critical.

Top AT needs:

- Low-cost AT (53%)
- Training (45%)
- Information about AT options (39%)
- Access to free or low-cost repairs (30%)

How? Equity through targeted funding.


- A percentage of the expected budget surplus
